Not a thought; not an invention, a discovery; not a heroic deed; not one flash of genius; not one single display of beroism; no light displayed; no laurels won; no nothing; he cried as a baby, and died as an

And that was the last of him So they passed away, one after the other, and left only that record. Out of this vast harvest, filled with sheaves, is there nothing to be remembered ?-Not an act; not a thought! not a philosophy! That recurring "and he died" sounded in my cars, as I read this chapter like the clash of the ocean on a solitary shore, that day and night, ceaseless breaks on the beach and means nothing. The great ocean, wave after wave, rolls on the shore, moans breaks and flows out; so human life seems to be beating incessantly upon the shore of death; and the vast population breaks and dies, and flows backward and forward, meaning-next to nothing. What a pity Here stand these empty names, and there stand those vast antediluvian giants; there stand the progenitors of the vast army of historical

Has not the great body of men, ever since, lived through the same empty routine of exist-ence? May it not be safely said that nine persons that lived on the globe, may be described as having been born, as having ate, slept cribed as having been born, as having ate, slept tieles, in quantity and variety to neet the wants of
