Thurday, 13th August, 1868. HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR GENERA IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 29th year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled: "An Act to provide against the introduction and spreading of disorders affecting certain animals," authority is given to the Governor in Council to take such measures as may appear to be necessary in order to prevent the introduction of contagious or infectious disorders affecting cattle and other animals, and to check such disorders from spread-

ing if introduced;
And whereas a contagions disease or epidemic, affecting Horned Cattle, prevails in many parts of the United States of America, and is increasing and extending its ravages; and whereas it is expedient in order to prevent the introduction of the same into the Provinces of Quebec and Ontario, heretofore constituting the Province of Canada, that the importation of Horned Cattle, from the United States of America, should be prohibited—
His Excellency in Council, on the recommendation of the Honorable the Minister of Customs, and under the authority given by the said Act, has been pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered that from and after the date hereof, and until this order shall have been altered or revoked, the importation from the United States of or revoked, the importation from the United States of America, or introduction therefrom into the Provinces of Quebec and Ontario, heretofore constituting the Province of Canada, or into any part thereof, of Horned Cattle, be and the same is hereby prohibited.


