Cap. 8, that the Order in Council of the 28th of January, 1868, authorizing and allowing a Drawback of one cent per pound on all Malt used in the manufacture of Beer, when brewed from Malt and Sugar combined, be revoked, and in lieu thereof the following "Regulation" be adopted, viz:— "Brewing, of not less than fifteen pounds of Sugar,
