place annually in Babylon. "In every district," says the historian, "they assemble on a certain day of every year all the virgins of a marriageable age." The most beautiful were first put up, and the man who bid the larges sum of money gained possession of her. The second in personal appearance followed, and the bidders gratified themselves with handsome wives according to the depth of their purses .-But alas? it seems that there were in Babylon some ladies for which no money was likely to be offered, yet these also were disposed of-so provident were the Babylonians. "When all the beautiful virgins," says the historian, "were sold, the crier ordered the most deformed to stand up; and after he had openly demanded who would marry her with a small sum, she was at length adjudged to the man who would be satisfied with the least; and in this manner the money arising from the sale of the handsome served as a portion to those who were either of disagreeable looks, or that had any other im perfection. This custom prevailed about 500 years before Christ.
