Animals for the purpose of breeding 1.00 must have been owned and kept within the County at least four months previous to the Show. 4 .- Applications for Premium on Root Crops and 2.00 Grain grown on a given quantity of land must exhibit an average sample of one bushel at the Show; and must on or before the first day of December deliver to 3.00 the Secretary a statement of the amount raised upon 2.00 the specified quantity of land, sworn to by himself and 1.00 another credible person. 5 .- No Competitor allowed to receive more than one premium on articles of the same kind or character, 1.50 except in Class I, Live Stock. 6 .- Articles must be entered with the Secretary, 2.00 Working oxen in yokes 3.0 who will present each Competitor with a numbered

2.00 ticket, corresponding to the entry in his book, which must be attached to the article or animal exhibited, and the premium will be awarded to the respective 2.00 numbers. 7 .- Applicants for Premiums on Live Stock must, 1.00 on entering their articles, furnish the Secretary with 2.00 a written statement of age, breed, mode of raising, 1.50 &c. Entry will be refused until this statement is 1.00 furnished. 8 .- Applicants for Premiums on Crops must, on entering their articles, furnish the Secretary with a similar statement, according to a form which will

9.—The owners of animals must furnish halters of 1.00 ropes and place and tie them securely in the position, and after the mode directed by the Officers of the exhibition. 10. -Competitors will not be allowed the custody of any animal or article exhibited after being placed 8-4 1.00 in position assigned by the Officers, nor to remove or interfere with it any way, except under their directions, until the close of the Show; nor will they be allowed

to be present or to interfere with the Judges in any way while these are occupied with their examinations.

Any violation of this Regulation will exclude the offender from receiving any Premium.

11.—Grains, Seeds, and Root Crops must be brought to the Exhibition building on the afternoon preceeding the Show, so as to give the Officers time to have all the different articles properly arranged, weighed, examined, and judged, before the building is opened on the morning of the Show. All the articles will be carefully guarded through the night. The doors of this department of the Exhibition will be open from 1.00 10 till 4 o'clock. 12.—All other articles for Exhibiton must be on

the ground before half-past 10, a. m. The doors will be closed at half-past 11, a. m., and the Judges will enter upon their duties. After they have finished 2.00 the doors will again be opened, and remain open until 13.—The decisions of the Judges will be final as to 1.50 the respective merits of the articles. They will be at liberty to withhold any Premium in any department, if they consider that no animal or article in the department is of sufficient merit. 14.—Special Premiums will be awarded upon any article not in the List, if such are offered, as the

Judges consider worthy of encouragement.

15.—Tickets will be issued to intending Exhibitors at the President's effice in Woodstock, on Monday
