The distance of the earth from the sun is 195,000,000 miles which being the radius of the earth's orbit, we shall have its diameter 390,000,000 miles and consequently the circumference 1,225,000,000. Now as the earth revolves round the sun once in 365 days, would travel (dividing 1,225,000,000 by 365) Just received direct from about 3,360,000 miles in one day, or 140,000 in an hour. By this calculation we shall find that the earth is whirled through the immense regions of space, at the amazing, the inconceivable velocity of 2,330 miles in a single minute


