It is to be feared this will continue until a change is made, and better inducements offered. We will not hope that the framers of a new School Act will prevent these constant changes. Why should they? It is a business, and as such, it will continue to change.

Several changes have been made during the year in the Denominational Schools, most of them for the better. St. Basil Academy and St. Basil's School have been made to admit male as well as female students; this must largely increase the attendance and secure to the ladies of the Province a more efficient and useful institution. Several competent female teachers have been obtained, and are now actively engaged in teaching. We may look forward with confidence to the future of these schools, as well as to the education of the country.
