

Even the famous orchids generally have green blossoms, and those which are splendid ornaments of our conservatories are quite rare .--There are no such brilliant effects of masses of color as are to be seen so abundantly in the appletrees, heaths, rhoderndrons, laurels and Judas-trees of temperate climes. 


