Intercolonial Railway.

THE Commissioners appointed to construct the Intercolonial Railway give Public Notice that having annulled the contracts for bections Nos. 5. 6 and 7, they are prepared to receive Tenders for re-letting the same Section No. 5 is in the Province of Quebec, and extends from the Easterly end of Section No. 2, forty miles east of Riverie Du Loup. to the 66th mile post. near Rimouski, a distance of about 26 miles.

Section No. 6 is in the Province of New Brunswick,

and extends from the Easterly end of Section No. 3, opposite Dalhousie, to the West side of the main Post opposite Dalhousie, to the West side of the main Post road, near the 48th mile post, Easterly from Jacquet River, a distance of about 21 miles.

Section No. 7 is in the Province of Nova Scotia, and extends from the Southerly end of Section 4, near River Philip, to Station 0, (formerly Station fifty,) at Folly Lake, a distance of about 24 miles.


