Intercolonial Railway.

THE Commissioners appointed to construct the Intercolonial Railway give Public Notice that having annexed the contracts for sections Nos. 5, 6 and 7, they are prepared to receive Tenders for re-letting the same.

Section No. 5 is in the Province of Quebec, and extends from the Eastern end of Section No. 4, to the mile post of 100 miles, to the 6th mile post, near Riverview, a distance of about 26 miles.

Section No. 6 is in the Province of New Brunswick, and extends from the Eastern end of Section No. 5, to the mile post of 140 miles, to the 10th mile post, near Riverview, a distance of about 26 miles.

Section No. 7 is in the Province of Nova Scotia, and extends from the Eastern end of Section No. 6, to the mile post of 180 miles, to the 14th mile post, near Riverview, a distance of about 26 miles.

The Commissioners also give public notice, that they are prepared to receive Tenders for four further sections of the line.

Section No. 17 will be in the Province of Quebec, and will extend from the Eastern end of Section No. 16, to the mile post of 220 miles, to the 18th mile post, near Riverview, a distance of about 26 miles.


