TO THE ELECTORS OF CARLETON COUNTY.
GENTLEMEN.—At the Election held in this County in 1868, on declaration day, at the instigation of my friends, I declared myself a Candidate for our suffrage at the next Election. We are on the eve of that Election. I take this early opportunity to give publicity to the previous declaration, that the name may have it to say on this occasion, "Your Card was out too late." As no political question is at issue, I shall cheerfully and assiduously endeavor to assist any gentleman having this requisite. I must be elected independently by you if elected at all.
A Free Common School System with as much aid as possible from Government, as the Public Chest will admit of, is what New Brunswick in the nineteenth century needs.
Ladies need be said to the Public Domain until it is ascertained how much will be left after the recent grant for Railway purposes.
Improvement of the harbor, and the dark ages, is strongly interested with Barbarism, and shall save my unqualified opposition to any measure which is placed upon the statute book to protect the Creditor.
Every facility that can possibly be afforded to assist the Pioneer of New Settlements either by public grants of money, or Free Grants of Land or in making Roads and Bridges, should in my estimation receive the approbation and support of every well wisher of the country.
Well regulated Agricultural Societies are in my opinion an absolute necessity in an Agricultural County like this; great blessings must necessarily accrue from the importation of Stock and Seeds, as well as by improved modes of husbandry in all its details, so rapidly brought about where districts are banded together for mutual purposes. These should be under the special care of the Government, and at all times receive their appropriate encouragement.
Many good Temperance men would be content to have a prohibitory law. Temperance laws, like Common law, are a curse, and that is finally. Nothing short of a sound and well guarded Prohibitory law will satisfy me on this point, and I firmly believe that this is the only way to the statute book, as well as this Local Prohibition, which I have no doubt will be a great blessing to the County.
A bridge across the river St. John, in this County, together with an extension of Railway to Riviere du Loup, is only a question of time, and being so understood it becomes simply one of the duties of the Legislature to provide for its construction.

Believe me, Gentlemen, I am as candid as I am plain. On a dollar for the seat, I repeat it upon principle, if elected you must elect me. By the invaluable house of responsible Government, the whole rests where it should with you, let no local or side issue deter you from giving an independent vote, with the result I shall be content to accept.
