He rose to great eminence as a scholar, was very useful as a minister of Christ, and, many years before his death, which took place when he was seventy-two, he visited his father and mother, who were delighted to see their son not only "a great scholar," but a pious bishop. Such was the history of Dr. John Prideaux, who used to say, "If I had been parish clerk of Ugborough, I should never have been Bishop of Worcester." 
