113 EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR GENERAL

WHEREAS by the Act 33 Vic., Cap. 3, Section 28, intituled "An Act to amend and continue the Act 32 and 33 Vic. Cap. 3, and to establish and provide for the Government of the Province of Manitoba it is provided that such provisions of the Customs Laws of Canada (other than such as prescribe the rate of duties payable) as may be from time to time de-clared by the Governor General in Council, to apply to the Province of Manitoba, shall be applicable thereto and in force therein accordingly. His Excellency in Council on the recommendation of the Honorable the Minisfer of Customs and under the authority aforesaid, has been pleased to Order, and it is hereby Ordered, that the following provisions of the Customs Laws of Canada, being the Acts in parts of Acts of the Parliament of Canada
