There is no humbug about the seed, for I imported it two springs ago from the State of Vermont. The seed cost me at the rate of \$20 per bushel. It was recommended to yield 100 bushels from one bushel, sowing one bushel to the acre. Last spring Richard Hall sowed one peck of these seeds on new land, about the 30th of June, and he reaped from that quantity, 32; bushels, thus proving that they will yield what they are recommended, if they have a fair chance.
