Communicated. OUR LAWRENCE CORRESPONDENCE. MR. EDITOR,—In my last, I was on my way to the BLEACHING ROOM, to which place we were speedily taken by our com-municative guide, and the process of bleaching and cleaning were showed and described to us. The substances required to be got rid of in the purification of cotton, unbleached, are-1st the organic coloring matter naturally present in the fibre; 2nd, resinous and fatty bodies, also inherent in the fibre; 3rd, weavers' dressing and prespiration taken up during the process of spinning; and 4th, certain saline or earthly substance. The first stage in the bleaching process is the singeing of the cloth, which is accomplished by drawing the cloth rapidly over a red hot iron cylinder, which burns off the surface hairs or minute threads which communicate a fibrous down or nap to the surface of the cloth, and if allowed to remain, would interfere with the uniform application of the colors in printing.
