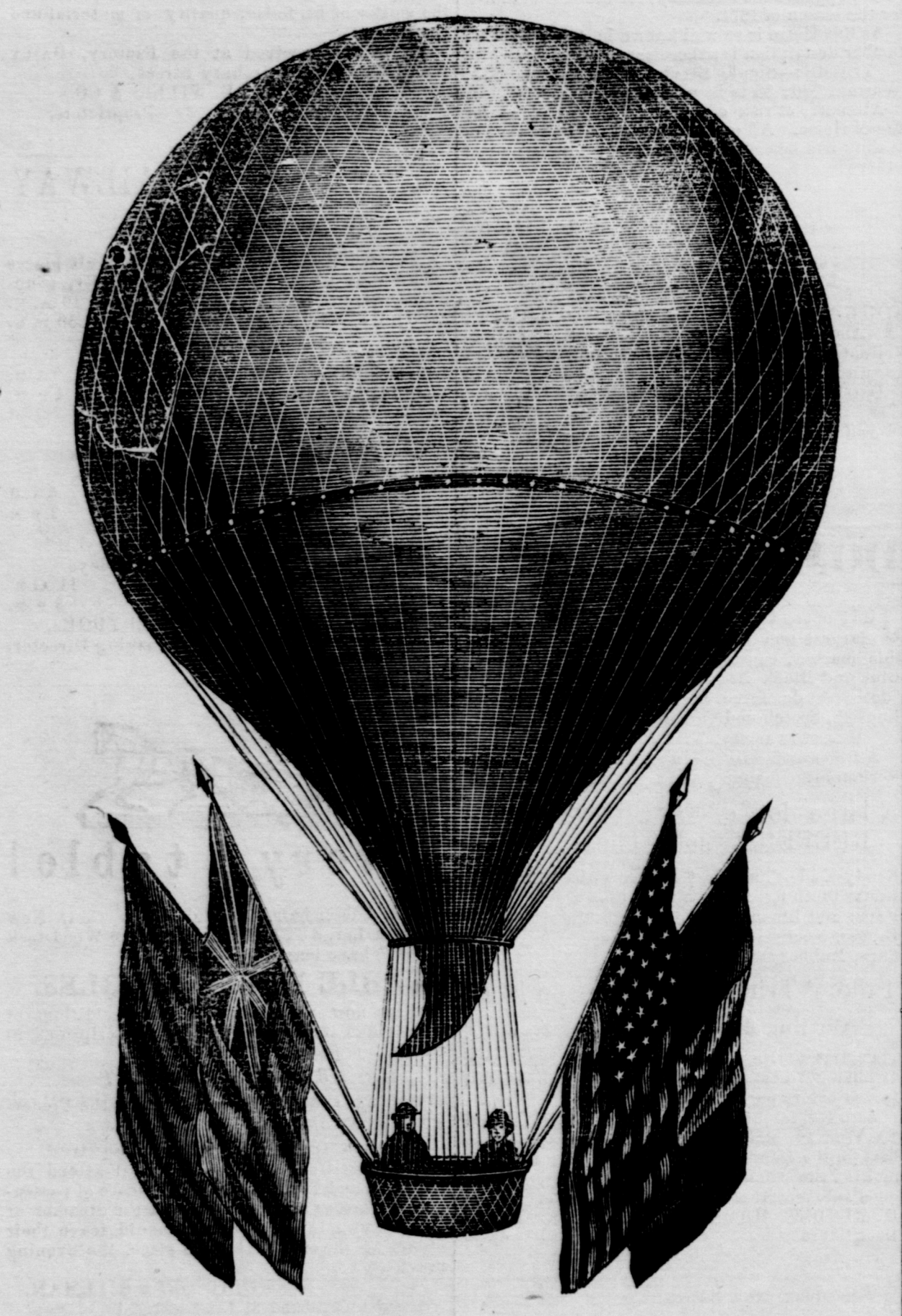

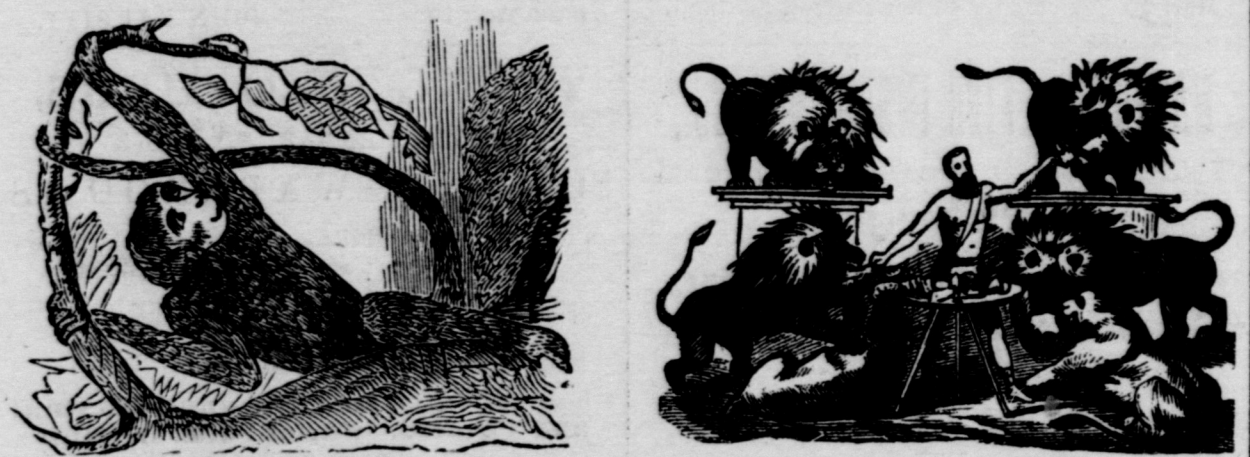

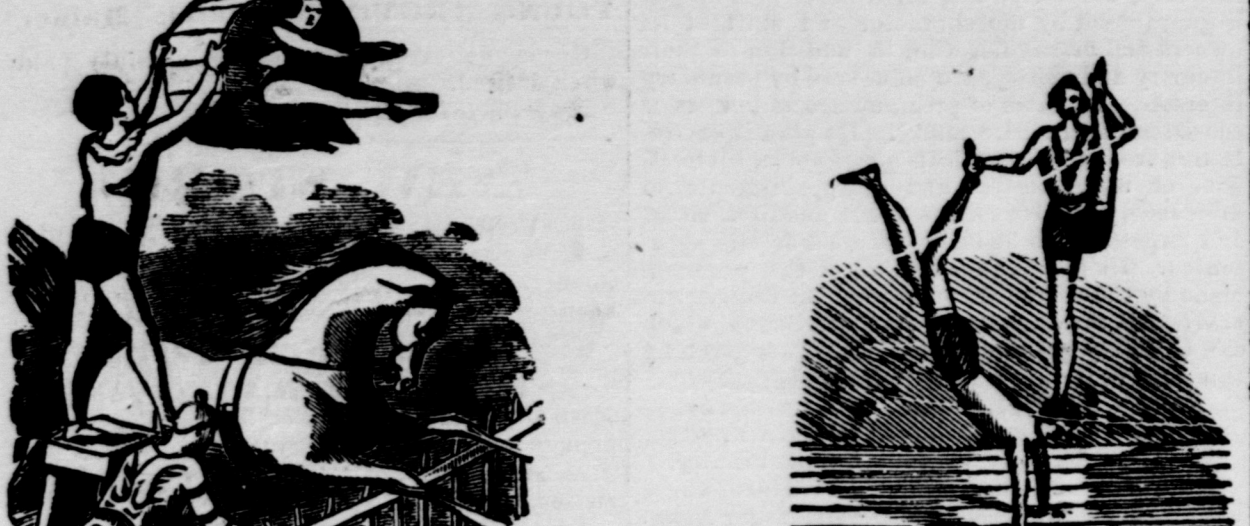

The following is the Programme for competition:

**4 Years Old Colts.**

Purse of \$50 for the fastest trotting Four Year Old Colt. Mile heats to harness. Best 2 in 3—Two-thirds to first; one-third to second. Commence at 9 a. m.

**Horses that never beat 3 minutes.**

Purse of \$50, open to all Horses that never beat 3 minutes. Mile heats to harness. Best 3 in 5, at 10 a. m. Two-thirds to first; one-third to second.

**3 Years Old Colts.**

Purse of \$50 for the fastest trotting Three Year Old Colt. Mile heats to harness. Best 2 in 3, to harness. Half-mile heats. Two-thirds to first; one-third to second. To take place at 2 p. m.

**SWEETSTAKES.**

Purse of \$100, open to all Horses. Mile heats to harness. Best 3 in 5. To take place at 3 p. m.

Two-thirds to first; one-third to second.

All competitions will be governed by the Rules and Regulations of the Association.

Entries should be on or before the 30th day of June, instant, at 12 noon; but entries will be received for each competition up to 9 o'clock, a. m., July 1st.

Entrance Fee 10 per centum of the purse. In order to make a race there must be three horses entered, and two to start.
