Fifty thousand people are homeless, and most of them in a destitute condition. The unburnt streets for miles are lined with household goods. No one dare think what the loss of life may be. The flames swept though the city with the rapidity of a prairie fire, and many persons must have perished. Telegraphic communication has been again established. Munificent offers of assistance are received from all quarters. Tents and cooked food are being sent.
