

The history and character of these claims, under an investigation by a legislative resolve by the Governor and Coun-cil in 1870, show that by the treaty of 1783, the North-eastern boundary of Maine was a line running due north from the monument at the head-waters of the St. Croix near the north line of Amity to the northern line of the State. By the Washington treaty, in 1842, a conventional line was established which began on the old line at the monument and diverged to the west gradually as it went north, thus cutting the easterly ends off all the townships of land lying between the monument and the northern line of the State. 
