

FRANKS IN HIGH PLACES.—Victor Hugo tells us that crime runs in ruts, and re-discovery is subject to the same law. We have not recovered from our astonishment at the frauds exposed in New York municipal affairs, before Col. Hodge, a favorite paymaster in the regular army, confided the embezzlement of half a million dollars of Government funds. The same day we learn that Post-Office has appropriated to his own use \$115,000 of the people's money, and that the postmaster at Atlanta, Georgia, has stolen as largely as the revenue of his smaller office would permit. Col. Hodge was stationed at Washington, and since his arrest has been confined at Fort McHenry. His defalcations, General, have extended over a period of six or seven years, and amount in the aggregate to half a million dollars. He says he has lost the money in stock speculation. The people have reason to rejoice that justice is overtaking plunderers in high places. Official corruption seems to be the greatest danger to which the country is exposed.—Houlton Times

Wide-spread sickness of a peculiar nature, resembling malarial fever, is prevailing with a few miles of Chicago, fifteen hundred cases having occurred. TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

LONDON, OCT. 1.—The Princess Alexandra arrived at Aberdeen on Saturday, and received a great ovation from the citizens. A number of English Channel caused many shipwrecks. Many lives are reported lost in full sight of the people on shore. The evacuation of the department of Alsace, France, is still delayed, but will be begun to-day. The Peace Congress at Lausanne, Switzerland, adjourned on Friday. The National Bank of Belgium raised its rate of discount to 5 per cent.

New York, Oct. 1.—The latest report from Cuba is that the insurgents have no thought of surrender. Dispatches from Constantinople state that the breaking of the suspension bridge, on Saturday, at Wiesbaden, has caused many deaths and many dangerously injured.

New York, Oct. 2.—Gold 114-5/8. The United States public debt was decreased thirteen and a half millions of dollars in September. Great fires are devastating the lumber regions of the West.

LONDON, OCT. 2.—The Italian bark *Soriente* went ashore in the late gale; six of the crew were saved. Four hundred women employed in the West Mills at Bolton, have joined the strikers and quit work. The alleged ill-treatment of German residents of France has called forth a strong protest from the German Government, while the continued German occupation aggravates the indignation of French men.

LONDON, OCT. 3.—Hon. Foster Bradford, in an address in London, on Monday, advocates compulsory education for England. They notified Granville that the Commemorative Treaty between France and England terminate at the beginning of 1872. In consequence of the rejection by the Lower Chamber of Sweden of a Government bill for the defense of the Kingdom, Ministers resigned.

The King is forming a new cabinet, and has named in the city of Messina, Persia, 2000 died from cholera, and 40,000 were made slaves of by the Afghans, who are taking advantage of their condition. Pestilence still rages, and the insurrection and indignations add to their calamity.

New York, Oct. 3.—The Mayor of Salt Lake City was arrested for adultery. Brigham Young is too sick to be removed from his house. There are five thousand U. S. troops before the city. No disturbance yet.

New York, Oct. 4.—Gold 113-3/8. Mayor Hall was arraigned in court to-day charged with signing fraudulent warrants on the City Treasury. The case was continued.

The Liquor Prohibition Party in Massachusetts to-day nominated Judge F. J. Plim for Governor, and the Labor Reformers nominated E. M. Chamberlain.

LONDON, OCT. 4.—Five miners were killed yesterday by explosion of fire-damp in Wales.—The Italian Government have determined that no Professor of the University of Rome will be permitted to continue the exercise of his functions without taking the oath of allegiance to Italy. A Court-Martial at Versailles is investigating the conduct of general officers who surrendered their forces to the enemy of the 18th war.
