### TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

London, April 12.—In the House of Commons last evening Rathborne asked whether Government had sent counter case respecting Alabama claimes to Geneva? Gladstone replied affirmatively; also that there was nothing relative to claims for indirect damages in the document. A note accompanied the case containing declaration of the Government, for the purpose of reserving all rights appearing to the Queen in arbitration, so that in future the Government would not be fettered by any implied compromise. Minister Schenck had been duly informed of the course taken, and he notified Granville of no objection on his part. The American ance, and on the most reasonable terms. counter case would be presented to the Geneva tribunal without prejudice to the rights of either party.
Schenck had since informed Granville that United States concurred in view that the presentation of the other counter case would not affect the position assuned by Great Britain on the question of indirect claims. In answer to a question asked by Disraeli, he said Cockburn would resume his duties at Geneva Board, and that the British counter case will be laid before Parliament at an early day. Disraeli said that he wanted to impress upon the Government that the country was desirous of clearly understanding the conditions under which the Government had sent its counter case to Geneva. This very act admitted on the surface the justice of the American claim for indirect damages. Gladstone replied documents would be speedily forthcoming. In the House of Lords Granville replied substantilly the same as Gladstone. The subject was discussed by Lord Russell., Duke of Richmond, Lord Westbury Marquis of Salisbury, Duke of Somerset Lords Penzance Denmore and Colonsay. In House of Commons later in the evening Lawson moved an address for the withdrawal of Great Britain from any Treaty binding her not to interfere with other nations by war. He promised to lay the documents before the House tomorrow. Great Britain and the United States were represented at Geneva yesterday, and the Counter Cases given to the Secretary of the Tribunal. None of the Arbitrators were present. Considerations of pure friendship for the United States by Spain induces her to offer to release Dr. Howard, although it does not admit that the prisoner has been wronged at all. London, April 16.—The text of the note accompanying the English counter case in the Alabama claims is published. It simply defines the indirect claims; states that a misunderstanding regarding them had arisen between the two countries; asks that arbitration proceed with reference only to claims for direct loss, and formally gives notice that this case is presented without prejudice to the position sssumed by the Government in the correspondence with the United States. It was laid before both Houses of Parliament. The Globe and other Tory papers are elated at the Government defeat by a majority on an unimportant amend-ment to the Ballot Bill.

OTTAWA, Aprill 17. Public accounts of the last fiscal year show the total receipts \$19,835,560; expenditures, \$15,623,081.
