Watchmaking in Switzerland.

(From the Swiss Times of May 30th.)

We have already drawn attention to the annual meeting of the Society of Arts held on the 23rd current, under the presidency of M. T. de Sausseur, and are now able to furnish some further details.

Professor Soret, in delivering a most interesting report, passed in review the operations of the industrial section, in reference to Commerce, leaving that stage of the competition to be taken up later in the manufacture of chronometers. This competition was instituted with the object of testing the workmanship and precision of chro-

nomers turned out by Genevieve manufacturers, and none but those adapted for pocket use were admitted. They were deposited in charge of the authorities at the Observatory, and underwent the most searching ordeal of trial by application to pocket instruments of this class. The jury were then asked to award the palm of excellence unanimously decided in favor of Messrs. J. M. Badollet & Co. of Geneva, who had distinguished their prize by exhibiting a chronometer which fulfilled all the conditions of the programme. The award crowned their first success by gaining honorable mention for two other chronometers. The allusion to the "Golden Fleece" was met with enthusiastic applause, and Professor Humbert, President of the Jury, declared that he was gratified with h-p-p-y and humorous dissertation upon subjects connected with this department.
