**Watchmaking in Switzerland.**  
(From the Swiss Times of May 30th.)  
We have already drawn attention to the an-  
nual meeting of the Society of Arts and  
23rd current, under the presidency of M. Th.  
de Saussure, and are now able to furnish some  
further details.  
Professor Soret, in delivering a most interest-  
ing report, passed in review the operations of  
the industrial section, in reference to Commu-  
nism, laying great stress upon the competition that  
has taken place in the manufacture of chronometers.  
This competition was instituted with the object

nometers turned out by Geneva manufacturers,

to pocket instruments of this class. The very  
speciality required to decide the difficult question  
as to whom to award the palm of excellence un-  
animously decided in favor of Messrs J. M. Bad-  
ollet & Co. This firm having carried off the sole  
prize by exhibiting a chronometer which fulfilled  
in the highest degree every condition required  
in their first prize by gaining honorable men-  
tion for two other chronometers. The altis-  
simo to this triple honor was received with en-  
thusiasm and applause. Professor Humbert, Presi-
