workmen were engaged making alterations in

other implements, forming a very complete  
set of burglary tools. They also discovered  
articles of wearing apparel, evidently  
intended as disguises for the gang, were also scattered  
around, together with a box of blanketing  
brushes, and other appliances of the kind.
