In New York City, for the past ten years, 132,103 persons, of whom 66,626 were men, and 65,674 women, were committed to the city prisons for intexication, alone, according to the city inspector's Cash. report. From 1851 to 1865, there were 2,522 deaths caused by intemperance, and from that period to the 31st of December, 1868, they amounted to 5,170.




