ENGLAND'S TROUBLES IN AFRICA.-Eng-

land has at present two difficulties to contend with in Africa. The first relates to the war

King of Ashantee. The second relates to the question of the slave trade at Zanzibar.

At this place affairs have assumed a threatening aspect, owing to the Sultan's refusal to accede to England's demand for the suppression of that vile traffic. Sir Bartle Frede, who was sent out by the British Government to effect this object has been unsuccessful .-The Sultan absolutely refused to sign any treaty or enter into any agreement with reference to the abolition of the slave trade.-This refusal is attributed to the influence of M. de Vieune, the French Consul at Zanzibar, for it appears that after that gentleman's arrival at the island-from which he had been temporarily absent—the tone of the Sultan changed. It seems, however, that the refusal of the Sultan to co-operate is not disastrous, for his power is merely nominal. The burden of the actual suppression of the slave transport would in any event have come upon the British Government.
