RELIGIOUS CENSUS OF PRISONS .- The

London Times says:—A Parlimentary return states that there were 156,146 prisoners in the county and borough prisons in England and Wales in 1872, and that 96,097 of the prisoners belonged to the Church of England, 38,581 were Roman Catholics, 10,648 Protestant Dissenters, 256 Jews, 9 Greeks, 57 belonged to other persuasions, 279 professed themselves of no religion, and the religion of 219 was not ascertained. Thus, nearly thireen-fourteenths either belonged to the Church of England or were Roman Catholics, more than nine-fourteenths belonging to the Church of England, and less than fourfourteenths being Roman Catholics. There were 133 salaried clergymen ministering to these 156,146 prisoners—namely, 118 belonging to the Church of England and 15 to the Church of Rome, the latter being about oneninth and the former eight ninths of the whole number. Besides there were services in the year 1872, and of this number 11,434 belonged to the Church of Scotland, 5,841 to land or Protestant Episcopal Church, and 10,740 were Roman Catholics.
