A large number of witnesses were examined, and the case most stubbornly contested by six of the leading attorneys of the State, Judge Maxwell presiding. The Judge gave the various questions which arose during the trial careful attention, and his rulings were principally against the prosecution. The trial lasted five days. At the close the Court gave the case
