Dear Sirs:-In answer to your enquiry I may say-that it does not appear to me that the matter of Professional Education among our Teach ers will be greatly promoted by the circulation of the numerous Treotises before the public .-Some of them are good Works, and some of them are not. Most of those published on this side of the water are chiefly, though not professedly, compilations of European books, and the compilation is not always judicious. I know of no Educational Works in the English language at all comparable to Currie's. They are carefully and thoughtfully written. Principles are clearly defined, and Practice receives, in consequence, a most intelligent and conscientious handling .-The " Common School Education ' is a requel to the author's Treatise on " Early and Infant Education." These books, if carefully studied, would be of much service to intelligent Teachers of fair culture, and would doubtless find a place in their private libraries if brought under their notice It is true that in New Brunswick we neither have nor desire to have out and out Infant Schools any more than we do the system of School "Organization" which obtains in Great Britain. But what is said of these subjects in Currie's books rather increases than lessens their value for the thoughtful reader in this country Without intending to subscribe to all the views expressed in these two books, I may say that, in
