WHEREAS by the Act 23 Victoria, chapter 3, section 29, entitled: "An Act to amend and continue the Act 22 Victoria, chapter 3, and to establish and provide for the Government of the Province of Manitoba" it is provided that "such provisions of the Laws of Canada respecting the inland Revenue, including those fixing the amount of duties, as may be from time to time declared by the Governor General in Council applying to the said Province shall apply thereto, and be in force therein accordingly."
