**AUDITOR'S REPORT.**  
Your Auditor submits his 17th annual  
report on the financial operations of the  
County, and the several parishes.  
The receipts of the year 1873 amounted to  
\$15,082.31. The expenditure on \$15,087.64,  
being an excess of receipts over expenditure  
of \$5.33. On the first of January 1873,  
there was a balance on hand of \$2,576.63,  
this amount added to the receipts of the year  
shows a balance now in the hands of the Sec-  
retary Treasurer of \$3,711.30, but against  
this balance there are to be counted School  
warrants past due amounting to \$1,723.74,  
leaving only an available balance of \$2,047.56  
to meet the appropriations of this session and  
the various requirements of the County, until  
such time as the proceeds of the assessment  
for the current year begin to come in. For  
several years the balance in the treasury at the  
annual session of Council has been about the  
same amount as that just stated, and ex-  
perience has proved that amount to be not  
larger than absolutely necessary to provide for  
current requirements.  
The account of the Secretary Treasurer  
herewith submitted shows in minute detail the  
transactions upon which the above figures  
are based.
