They were operating in St. John and its vicinity six mills, which must now stop, let us hope only temporarily, they had extensive connections here, and their resources in logs, ships, lands and other property is immense. There is a hopeful feeling to-day that this business must continue. The Freeman this morning reports the liabilities of the firm to banks here at between \$500, 000 and \$550,000, which is, we believe nearly correct. No correct estimate can just now be made of the whole liability. The effort of Messrs. Jewett to float a great public enterprise that would prove of immense benefit to this country, has undoubtedly led to the present condition of things, They had, from the first, faith in this railway enterprise, and they embarked largely in it in the hope that it would prove successful. Public and private sympathy for them is very deep and sincere; and for the head of the St. John house, whose high personal character as a man and a citizen bas made him so greatly esteemed in this city, the feeling is deeper than mere words can express.
