London, Jan. 30 .- Archbishop Manning has issued a pamphlet of 200 pages in reply to Mr. Gladstone's expostulations. He maintains that the Vatican decrees have not changed the condition of civil allegiance.— The allegiance of the Catholics are as undivided as that of any other Christians. Questions of consequence alone could divide it.—
The recent decrees have not extended the power of the Pope. The Æcumenical Council in no way trenched on the relations of Church and State. Its decrees merely declared the doctrines, which were already matters of faith. The Pope cannot, therefore, by virtue of either of these decrees on his supreme authority, make any claim upon his adherents of a nature to impair the integrity of their civil allegiance.
