HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR GENE-RAL IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS, by Order in Council of the 7th day of June, 1871, it is directed that sworn declarations and machinists' certificates be 20 in all cases required preliminary to the admission free of duty, of machinery not manufactured in the Dominion for use in Canadian manufactures, and whereas, by the Act 37 Vic. chap. 6, the same machinery is made subject to an ad valorem duty of ten per cent, to take effect on the first day of January next, and whereas it is desirable to simplify the practice of the Customs in such cases,—due regard being had to the security of the revenue.

His Excellency the Governor General in Council on the recommendation of the Hon. 
