TEMPERANCE AND PROHIBITORY LEAGUE AND CONVENTION.	
The Third Annual Session of the New Brunswick Temperance and Prohibitory League will be held at Fredericton, commencing Tuesday, 29th February, at 7 P.M. The friends of the League are earnestly requested to make it a point to give their attendance at this session, as business of importance, and vitally affecting the interests of the League will be brought up.	
The cause of action adopted by the Dominion Prohibitory Convention, at Montreal last autumn, is necessary, that we should have met not a realization of the fears of those who feared bankruptcy avoided. The oft repeated statement that the expenses of the Legislature and the departments may be very materially lessened, without doing injury to or placing in peril the public credit, has not been controverted by valid argument, and the present is the time when the Legislature should consider the subject with a determination to compass reform in this direction.	
The Crown Land regulations require attention. The smaller the quantity of land in the hands of the public, the more valuable, domain, the more urgent the claims for its judicious management. The whole public lands of the Province should be surveyed, classified and laid out in lots, and disposed of by an equitable system of sale, so that the public interest in the land should be maintained, and the revenue derived therefrom should be a valuable addition to the public treasury.	
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
