

But this is not all. This English brother-in-law was not satisfied with the share of profits that came in this way, but by the time the money came in, he and people of Canada out of a large addition. But this is not all. An action was entered against him by the present Government on their account, and power was fraud, and a judgment obtained for \$10,000 of the money so embezzled.

The people, soon to be called upon to decide between the two political parties, are in right and duty bound to judge them by their acts. It is fair to state from the records what they have done. I might easily pursue these investigations into other of the late Government's transactions, and show how for twenty years in Canada the Tories, under the leadership of Sir John, have gone on from scandal to scandal, until to his own words, they were "steeped to the lips in corruption," long before the Pacific Scandal was the means of their destruction. That great scandal was only the outgrowth of a system that had been in operation for years, concealed in part from some of Sir John's associates it is to be hoped, but still existing, and in active operation. The steady resistance to electoral reform, the opposition to the trial of election petitions by the judges, the efforts to keep placemen in Parliament were but of a piece with the contract jobbery and the sale of the great Charter to Allan under which was the corrupt motive to hold power at any price.

OUR ENGLISH LETTER.

Liverpool, Eng., March 28, 1878.

Things are indeed looking very gloomy this week. The most sanguine of the peace-lovers are now expecting to hear, almost any day, that war is declared. News from the continent seems to confirm the feeling. Russia will not yield to the demand of England, that the whole of the articles be laid on the table, and England being cognizant of this, will not go to a conference muzzled, consequently there will be no conference at all, as France and Italy will follow the course adopted by England. The Russian press is very warm at England circumventing Russia's scheme and does not allow opportunity to slip by which it can heap opprobrium on England and please its semipagan subscribers.

A frightful catastrophe occurred last Sunday. Her Majesty's ship "Eurydice" was returning on a winter cruise to the West Indies, and was out on a cruise, when, on the morning of the 27th, a sudden squall struck her. She righted herself, but another black squall struck her, and she foundered. There were 320 officers and seamen on board, and training on the ship when this melancholy accident happened, but the list will be greatly augmented when the number of passengers is made known. The Queen sent the following telegram to the First Lord of the Admiralty:—The Queen would ask Mr. Smith, First Lord of the Admiralty, to make known her grief at the terrible calamity of the "Eurydice," and her heartfelt sympathy with the afflicted parents and relatives.

Other telegrams have been received from Her Majesty, all full of the deepest concern for the mourners, and grief at the accident. The Prince and Princess of Wales and the Prince and Princess of Monaco, and Prince Louis Napoleon, at Chislehurst.

Twenty thousand dollars worth of jewelry were stolen last Sunday night from the house of a gentleman named St. Paul, who was taken from a dressing-room, the robbery taking place while the family were at dinner.

A heavy snow storm visited the British Isles on Sunday afternoon attended by flashes of lightning and peals of thunder.

The extent to which some ministers give to their feelings in the public is as disgusting as it is frequent. Last Sunday evening the Rev. J. Ash, Vicar of St. Paul's Church, in announcing a collection, said, he hoped the congregation would give more liberally than usual, and the great majority would not give even the skin of their teeth. When the Rev. gentleman concluded the pulpit, he apologized for being so "savage" in his observations, and added:—

"I have told you often that you are saved by faith, but show me your faith by your works, and if you don't do more liberal in your giving I will stop you from going to heaven for I will meet you at the gate and stop you from going in; that I will, and won't be a pleasant thing to do, but I will do it."

At the Oxford Circuit, on Friday, before Justice Baggallay, John Harris was indicted for the willful murder of his wife and two children. He had been incarcerated in a lunatic asylum, but had recovered, and he returned home last autumn. He appears to have imbibed the notion that during his absence from home his wife had been unfaithful to him, and frequent quarrels arose between them on that account. The jury was ordered him to be kept in custody during her Majesty's pleasure.

Another lunatic (a woman) has taken the life of her child. Being left alone with the child, she took a table-knife, severing the head of her infant. She said she hoped God would forgive her, but that the child she had killed was the real Sir Arthur Orton, and not child of hers. The jury returned a verdict to the effect that the child was killed by its mother, who, however, could not be held responsible for her actions. This shocking occurrence occurred at Bournemouth.

Mr. Wm. Dixon, who was once Mayor of Southampton, has committed suicide. He had been involved in debt, which fact appears to have affected his mind, inducing him to poison himself by taking a large dose of prussic acid.

On Monday last, Miss Charlotte Cox, a telegraph clerk in the General Post Office, another clerk, John Mullins, for £100, for breach of promise. The defendant pleaded infancy and got off clear. But he was old enough to marry another woman—which he did.

Mr. C. H. Spurgeon has returned to London from the continent, having regained his health by his visit to parts more remote. During the three weeks of the Rev. gentleman's absence, Messrs. Clark and Sumner have held special services at the Metropolitan Tabernacle. During these services there were no fewer than 470 anxious enquirers. Many backsliders have been reclaimed. The old lady, who had been listening to Mr. Spurgeon for 12 years, was converted.
