

Theis Province has given more, in proportion to its size and population, to aid Railway enterprises than any of the other Provinces, and it has less to show for the money. The reason of this probably is that the money was given in some cases, not because the proposed road was really wanted, or because private enterprise had done so much as to deserve encouragement, as because party exigencies required that some individuals, or some localities, should be satisfied. The annual report on Railways, made to the Dominion Government, shows that Ontario gave, up to June, 1880, little more than five million dollars; the government of Quebec nearly 131 million dollars, including the whole cost of the road from Quebec to Ottawa built by the government, and the government of Nova Scotia gave \$1,-844.840; but New Brunswick gave over hree million dollars! distributed as fol-
