gret of the death of that most eminent and popular divine—Dean Stanley—which oc-cured somewhat suddenly and unexpectedly at London on the 18th inst. So recent as the 7th inst. he caught a chill that settled into erysipelas, from which he died. It would be difficult to trace the sources from whence the extreme popularity and fame of this preacher has sprung. His college career was brilliant, but not so much so as many men of less note. His books were numerous, but on subjects that tended little towards gaining popularity with the general public. Lucrative honours however, were literarly showered upon him from time to time, till ultimately in 1863 he was appointed Dean of Westminister, which he retained till his death. In 1871 the University of St. Andrews, in Scotland, conferred upon him the degree LL.D., and in 1875 the students of that University elected him Lord Rector. It is almost entirely upon his private character as a man, and his fame as a preacher, that his great popularity rests.
