On the 11th, the Report of the Minister of Agriculture was laid on the table. It shows a considerable increase in immigration to Canada over previous years. It is estimated that emigrants brought to Canada in effects over \$400,000 and in money \$3,700,000, in all over \$4,000,000.

A return brought down to-day shows there were exported in the last six months of 1881 from Canada, of products of the forest, anima's and agricultural, \$48,594,190 worth, and imported of the same articles, in the same period, \$7,271,531 worth, the exports of these articles exceeding the imports by

\$41,323,659. On the 12th, there was an interesting discussion on the Dominion Land policy, arising out of an amendment to going into supply, moved by Mr. Charlten, who claimed that the Canadian land policy was not as liberal in its inducements to settlers as that of the United States, where the Government held no resources. He opposed the principle of Government Jencouraging colonization

Sir John claimed that the Government land policy was the best one for the country Owing to colonization schemes it might fairly be calculated that enough would be received in the treasury from the Northwest this year to pay half the liabilities of the Dominion to the Pacific Railway Co. It would be greatly to the credit of the Opposition if they would drop their partizan views and support that policy.

After recess Mr. Blake said the hon. gen-

tleman had expressed great indignation at any other member hinting at the possibility of corruption, butit was one of the principle duties of the representatives of the peo-ple to guard against the possibility of any corruption. History showed that there was one of the greatest dangers of constitutional government, and any member of Parliament had a perfect right to discuss the possibilities of evils arising from an undue exercise of the executive power. He believed there were many gentlemen on the Government side who were as high minded and henorable as any on this side of the House; but he did not place them all on the same high level, and it was the duty of every member to guard against the abuse of power by those to whom it was entrusted. He denied that the Opposition were opposed to selling lands as was alleged by gentlemen opposite; the resolution did not affect this matter at all except that it would secure to the Government the rec ipt of the full, not the half, price and the settler should pay the Government price instead of three or four times that

price to speculators. It was a very common thing for hon. gen-tlemen opposite to misrepresent a speech he (Mr. Blake) had made concerning emigration to the Western States and to give garbled extracts from it in order to make political capital; but the whole speech could be found in Hansard, and on referring to that it would be seen that it did not contain a single word that was improper or that was not strictly
