FEEDING FOR RAPID GROWTH.—As a general thing there is little danger of feeding growing fowls too much. During the period of growth when every part of the organic structure is undergoing developement the chicken will assimilate all the food it takes.

The experience of most all successful poultrymen is to feed often and as much at a time as they will pick up clean. This system of feeding is both economical and profitable. It first causes rapid growth and early development; and in the next place the faster they grow the better, so that you can turn you capital over more rapidly.

Very young chickens cannot consume enough food at one time to last them half a day, as their crops are small, their rapid growth and habitual exercise demand material proportionably nourishing and active to

develop a vigorous growth.

If chickens have a liberal range the grubs, worms and insects they pick up will greatly aid them to grow. 
