AGRICULTURE.
FEEDING FOR RAPID GROWTH.—As a general
thing there is little danger of feeding grow-
ing fowls too much. During the period of
growth when every part of the organic struc-
ture is undergoing development the chicken
will assimilate all the food it takes.
The experience of most successful poultry
men is to feed often and as much as a time
as they will pick up clean. This system of
feeding is both economical and profitable.
It first causes rapid growth and steady de-
velopment; and in the next place the faster they
grow the better, so that you can turn your
capital over more rapidly.
Very young chicks cannot consume
enough food at one time to last them half a
day, as their crops are small; their rapid
growth and habitual eating of small amounts
of food, and the fact that they are growing
material. Chicks confined in coops or
small runs must be supplied with a variety
of good food, escape from the table, soaked
corn and oatmeal and seasoned with pepper,
bits of bread soaked in milk, chopped green
pot or garlic, bits of clean sweet milk and
milk will be productive of the best state of
health and the most rapid growth.

VALUE OF HEN MANURE.—Should all the
droppings from the roosts by hens be care-
fully saved in barrels, and every year used
as a fertilizer? It is a question that has
been asked by many, and the answer is, yes.
It is a step further by supplementing grain, milk
and animal food to produce more efficient
