

# LEGISLATIVE CORRESPONDENCE.

**FREDERICTON, March 18, 1882.**  
 DEAR SENTINEL.—I am very sorry to have inadvertently misreported Mr. White in the matter referred to by him in his letter to you published in your issue today received.  
 The Budget debate is concluded; I may venture to say that since Confederation there has not been the same number of speeches delivered consecutively, more exhaustive and, generally speaking, more creditable, than those during the debate referred to. The full reports of the debate in the daily press will have it that the people pretty fully as to the alleged delinquencies and delusions of the Government.

The excitement of the week has been over the Clerk of the Peace enquiry. Briefly told, the story is this: On the committee were three gentlemen, including Mr. W. H. Smith, who, in the course of the enquiry, were asked to make a report of what was popularly termed a whitewash character. Two members of the committee, including the chairmen, Mr. W. H. Smith, and Mr. W. H. Smith, being of the opinion, and secured an attendance of a quorum to take upon a report, and as he chairman signed and offered as a report the evidence. This led to a warm and feeling discussion. The Speaker ruled that a quorum of members of a committee was necessary to the adoption of a report, and the result was that Mr. W. H. Smith withdrew his paper. Some time later Mr. W. H. Smith was arbitrary in rejecting papers submitted to committee. The general impression is that the Government and its friends should have been satisfied to have the evidence, without comment, submitted to the House. And their attitude in the matter is regarded as indicating either a fear to have the investigation take place, or an obstinate desire to thwart the views of the promoters thereof. The Speaker's ruling being correct, the action of any committee may be nullified by the non-attendance of its members.

Mr. Leighton presented the petition of G. W. Vanwart and over 140 other rate payers of Carleton County, praying that a bill to legalize the county valuation for 1881 might not pass and become law.

A bill introduced by Hon. Mr. Crawford and amended by the committee on Municipalities, has been under discussion. Its provisions are as follows:—

The County, City or Town Council of any municipality, city or town shall (by a vote of not less than two-thirds of their number suggested by the Council) in their discretion, have power to exempt from such taxes as the body as exempting have power to impose, in whole or in part, for any period of years not exceeding ten years, the capital stock, property and income of any joint stock company or individual or association of persons incorporated, hereafter establishing, or having heretofore established any mining, manufacturing, or industrial enterprise in said county, city or town, being the stock, capital and property invested in and actually employed in such mining, manufacturing or industrial enterprise; provided that such capital and property of such company, individual or association of persons as invested and actually employed in such mining, manufacturing or industrial enterprise shall amount to not less than \$10,000, and the order of exemption shall state the value of the property so exempted; And all resolutions or agreements made by any such Council under this Act, shall be binding on the successors of the Council making the same.

A bill to change the existing law as to provide that the Crown shall not receive less than \$8 for summing a Jury has been agreed to; \$20 has heretofore been the minimum. During the discussion on this bill Mr. White expressed pleasure at finding that the tone of the Assembly was improving. Last year he could only secure four votes for a similar bill, which was most strongly opposed by gentlemen who now supported the measure.

Progress was reported yesterday in a bill to authorize the Town Council of Woodstock to provide a system of Water Works for the Town. On submitting the bill Mr. Leighton explained the nature of the same, and stated that the subject had been discussed at public meetings in Woodstock and but little objection made to it.

It was pointed out by Mr. White and others that the bill was defective in that it only provided for a bare majority of the rate payers to bring it into force. (This majority must also represent a greater amount of property than those voting against it.—Eos. Sec.) and with regard to land damaged by Mr. Leighton was willing to amend the bill as suggested.

A majority and minority report of the Clerk of the Peace investigating committee was submitted, and Mr. Blair gave notice of motion to go into consideration thereof on Wednesday. I send these reports for use if you desire them.

House went into committee of supply and passed several bills without amendment, but not without much debate and some acrimonious speeches on some of the votes.

Mr. Leighton's bill to legalize the valuation in Carleton County for 1881 was agreed to. Night sessions are now in order; this may tend to induce long speeches to the detriment of the business of the House, but it may be questioned whether the practical business is facilitated.
