PROMOTING MILK.—The following from the London Live Stock Journal is a good state-

ment of some practical points suggesting the extent to which milking qualities are dependent on treatment and training:

"A copious flow of milk, sustained through many months, is a quality which has been wild produced by art in domestication. Wild cattle rarely provide more than enough milk to rear their own offspring, and the flow of it is of comparatively short duration. Small in volume, the milk is rich in quality, but of course, is in harmony with the requirements of the young animals in a wild state, and is a corelation of the roving life and the hap hazard feeding of the dame. More milk than the calf requires under such conditions would be a waste of maternal energy which nature does not encourage. It would, moreover, be an encumbrance to the mother. 
