

According to the Bangor Commercial, the lumber cut this winter on the Penobscot and tributary streams will be at least one-third lighter than that of last. Then the season was a most favorable Sept 2 one. It lasted four months, during which time fully 150,000,000 feet was cut, nearly all of which was turned into the streams. The total cut this season is estimated at from 95,000,000 to 100,000,000 feet. Last season 40,000,000 feet was cut on the Mattawamkeag, while this year it is not likely to be over 30,000,000. Last season's cut on the west branch of the Penobscot was about 50,000,000, and this season it will not exceed 35,000,000. Three-eighths of the season is already gone, and until recently there has been but a very light fall of snow. At present the average snow depth is fourteen to fifteen inches, and there is good hauling. There is a large overstock—some 60,000,000 logs—and if there shall be plenty of water in the spring, so that these, together with this season's cut, can be rafted to the mills, all will be well. Otherwise the stock for 1882 will be astonishing light and prices will be high.
