CARLETON Co. BUTTER .- The extent of the trade in butter between St. John and Carleton County is, perhaps, known to very few except those intimately concerned. One of the oldest agents in the trade told a News reporter to day that during the past twelve months about 125 tons of butter have been imported to this city from that County. Carleton Co. supplies as much butter to the local market as all other sections of the Province combined. Woodstock, Jacksonville Florenceville, Centerville, Hartford, Muniac, Bath and Glassville are the principal centres of supply, and the butter obtained from these localities can be relied upon for cleanliness and flavor. S. S. DeForest obtained this year from Carleton Co. about 20 tons of butter; Robertson & Slipp, 12 tons; S. F. Mc-Leod, 10 tons, while other dealers averaged from three to eight tons respectively. At 18c per lb. (average price), \$45,000 worth of butter reaches this market from that quarter.

It is stated in a late Baltimore despatel that the prelates of the Roman Catholic Church have, at a preliminary conference, discussed several matters of importance which will come up at the meeting with the Pope. 
