



THE following are the provisions of the new Electoral Franchise Bill as introduced and explained by Sir J. A. Macdonald to

the House of Commons, Ottawa :-

The object of the bill is to secure uniform ity in the franchise, so that the same classes of people shall have the franchise in the various Provinces. As far as Ontario and Quebec are concerned, it will be an enlargement of the franchise. It will affect the other Provinces variously, according to the principles upon which their franchises are at present formed. It is proposed that voters in cities, towns and incorporated villages shall have the same qualifications. Any person twenty-one years of age and a British subject shall have a vote if he is the owner of real property to the value of \$300. In Optario at present it is \$400. Every person who is a tenant in any city or town under lease shall have a vote if the lease is of the annual rental of not less than \$30. Every owner of real property within such city or town of the actual value of \$300 shall be entitled to vote; also residents of such cities or towns deriving an income from some calling of not less than \$400 annually and who have been resitoral district to the actual value of \$200, or vestments or charge of real property in Can-


