They eventually sold for \$2,500 and \$1,500 respectively. Sixty cattle sold for \$30,340, an average of \$505.66 per head, which may be considered as decidedly complimentary to the herd.

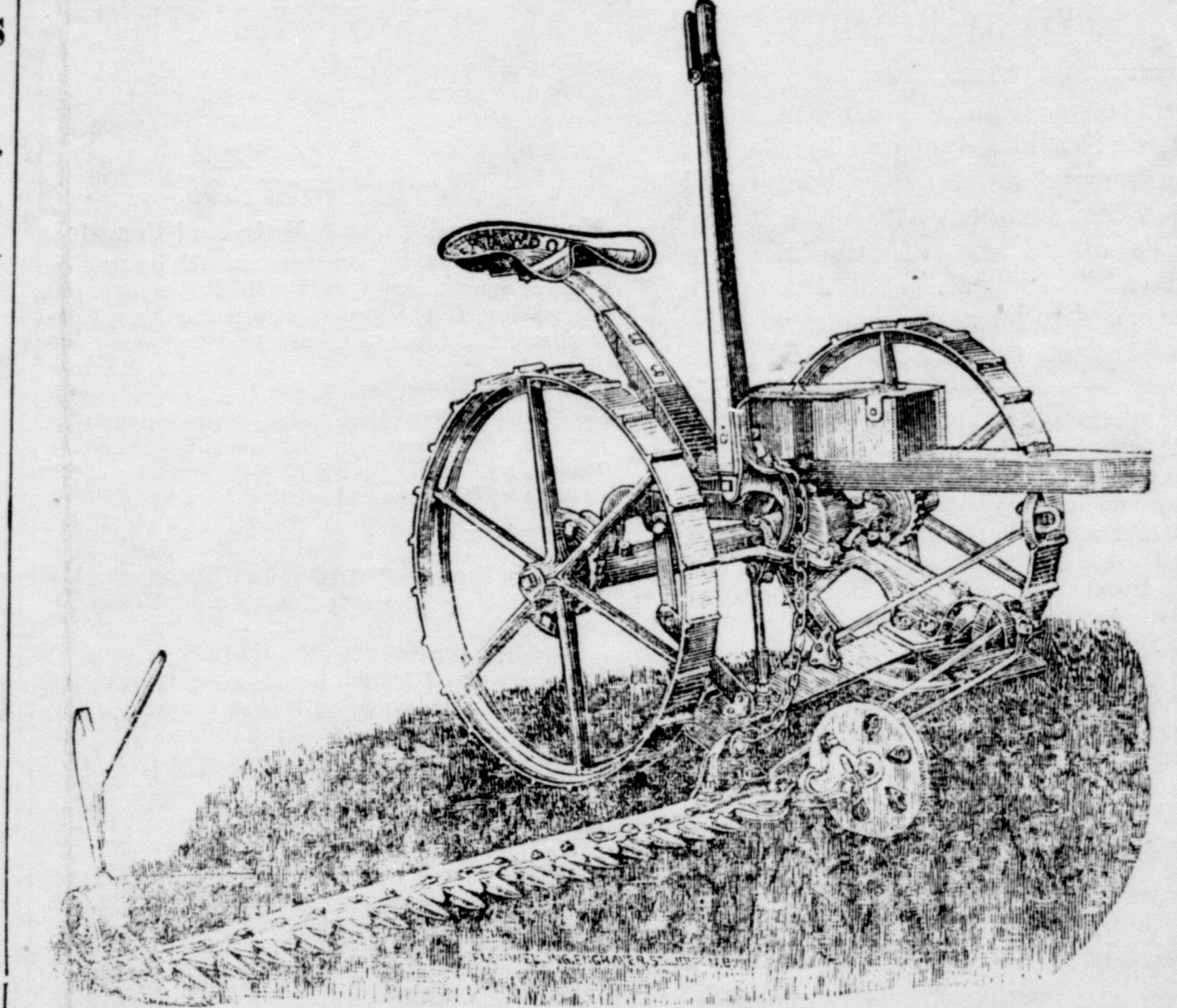
