



No. 3 Single Grave Two Bars with Canopy and Tablets.

No. 1 out represents the Fountain Enclosure enclosing cemetery lot 8 by 16 feet. No. 3 represents an enclosure for single graves The Fountain Enclosure is constructed of pipes; an enclosure, but vases are attached in which flowers, plants and vines may be placed. As the evaporation is greater in warm than in cool weather, it will be seen that the sup-ply of moisture is regulated according to the requirements of the plants. By filling the Fountain plants grow luxuriantly for months without further

The Fountain Enclosure is made in any size and supplied with granite or marble tablets on which is carved the memorial or inscription for the dead. The Canopy is for trailing vines. To fill the frame with water, remove one of the vases. The water is drawn off at the bottom to prevent freezing. The Fountain Enclosure is very durable and cheap, and, in connection with the growing plants, presents a prominent and pleasing appearance.

In the Underground Fountain the pipes are laid near the surface, and as the earth near the surface is warm both night and day during the summer season it will be found that the evaporation is just as effective as though the pipes were above ground, as shown in cuts Nos. 1 and 3.


