UNDERGROUND RESERVOIR, For Cemetery Lots, Double and Single Graves and Monuments.

No. 1 out represents the Fountain Enclosure, enclosing cemetery lot 8 by 16 feet.

No. 2 represents an enclosure for single graves, 20 ft. high.

The Fountain Enclosure is constructed of pipes; which, when filled with water, serves not only as an enclosure, but raises the water from the pipes, through the vases, plants and vines may be placed. In the Underground Fountain the pipes are laid near the surface, and as the earth near the surface is warm both night and day during the summer season it will be found that the evaporation is just as effective as though the pipes were above ground, as shown in cuts Nos. 1 and 2.

This system of irrigation is also adapted for Conservatories, Lawns, Window Gardening, &c.
