Keeper. 3. The Pound Keeper in addition to faces as sforesaid, shall be entitled to demand and receive before liberating any animal impounded for his trouble in taking charge of and feeding the same, the following sums:

For each horse, cow or, other neat cattle, the um of of Twenty cents for the first day, if not liberated within six hours after impounding, and Twenty five cents for each subsequent day; for each theep, goat or swipe the sum of Ten cents per day; and for poultry Five cents each per day; and he shall also be entitled to receive
