

**JOINTS.**  
The members of the company are making preparations for a grand celebration on the 24th May. We bespeak for the friends the generous cooperation of the friends of the company.

The members of the Albert Street Baptist Church choir are making arrangements for an Old Folks Concert on early date. Look out for it; it promises to be a grand affair.

Inspector Gause will make his yearly examination of the Town schools, beginning next week. The programme of visitation thus far has been as follows:—Monday afternoon, 10th inst., Miss McDonald's; Tuesday morning, 11th, Miss Jennie Price's; Wednesday morning, 12th, Miss Sharp's; Thursday morning, 13th, Miss Faulkner's; Friday afternoon, 20th, Mrs. Cupple's; Friday afternoon and Saturday morning, 21st, Mrs. McDonald's.

The public temperance meeting on Saturday evening was largely attended and at its close a number of signatures to the pledge were obtained. The Gospel temperance meeting Sabbath afternoon was addressed by Mr. Chubbuck who was later on by an audience which completely filled the Town Hall.

Mr. S. J. Parsons, the Secretary of the Carlton Co. S. S. Convention, has been a visitation of the several Sabbath Schools of the County. On Saturday evening Mr. Parsons addressed a public meeting at Bath, and on Sunday forenoon visited the Sabbath school at that place, which he found in a healthy condition. Sunday afternoon he visited the Bristol Sabbath school, which was also found to be in excellent working condition, and in the evening he addressed the claims of Sabbath Schools before a largely attended public meeting.

The railway bridge at Upper Woodstock took fire from a spark from a passing train one day last week; the flames were extinguished without damage.

On Sabbath afternoon a fire occurred at Upper Woodstock, which resulted in the loss of a large, connected with the double tenement house, one part of which is occupied by Mr. Wm. West.

Campbell, in the Methodist church, baptised six candidates, and at the close of the evening service, in sight of a very large congregation, extended the right hand of fellowship to eighteen members.

Evangelist Chubbuck concluded his interesting series of religious meetings here on Sabbath evening, and on the following morning left by train. He intends, we are told, taking a slight rest, and then going to Petticoat to conduct a series of services there.

On Monday evening St. Paul's Presbyterian Church took the necessary steps in extending a call to the Rev. Mr. McLaughlin, to become their Pastor. The Rev. Mr. Gaultman filled the pulpit for the Church for two Sabbaths this winter, when he gave evidence of more than ordinary ability.

While the Town Council are now paying considerable attention to the Fire Department, trying to render it as effective as possible, we trust they will not neglect to provide for fire purposes suitable books and ladders, without which, in many cases, the best efforts of the firemen are abortive. There has already been too much delay in this matter, and not a moment longer should be lost in providing every necessary apparatus.

Our Presbyterian friends were, we are glad to say, quite successful, with their "Basket Sabbath" in the Town Hall, Thursday evening of last week. Receipts about \$115.

Rev. G. W. McDonald and Mrs. McDonald were called to Fredericton, on Thursday, to attend the funeral of the sister of Mrs. McJ.

Honorable mention deserves to be made of the act of Mr. Lewis Smith, who at great personal risk, at the fire on King street, Monday, succeeded in placing a ladder where it was of inestimable benefit to the firemen in their heroic struggle.
